

# GEORGETOWN ROAD IMPROVEMENTS FROM 56TH STREET TO 62ND STREET

RebuildIndy is Mayor Greg Ballard's initiative to transform the city through investment in infrastructure improvements to restore deteriorating thorough fares, residential streets, sidewalks and bridges, as well as address neighborhood drainage and flooding issues and demolish unsalvageable abandoned homes that pose a public safety threat to neighborhoods.

These construction projects will create local jobs and ultimately increase public safety for neighborhoods and residents, which supports Mayor Ballard's commitment to make Indianapolis a more livable city.

## **PROJECT SCOPE**

The Indianapolis Department of Public Works (DPW) plans to widen the existing stretch of Georgetown Road from 56th Street to 62nd Street. Georgetown Road between Lafayette Road on Indianapolis' northwest side was originally constructed as a two-lane road in 1969/1970 and was resurfaced in 1993.

The corridor was planned with future widening in mind. The current configuration of Georgetown Road is inadequate to handle the current amount of traffic generated.

As part of the project improvements, the existing stretch of Georgetown Road from 56th Street to

62nd Street will consist of two through lanes in each direction, with curb and gutter on the exterior and a raised center median. In addition, a multi-use path will be added on the west side of Georgetown Road. On the east side of the road, a sidewalk will be added.

The project is scheduled to begin in August 2013 and be completed by October 2014. Through traffic and local access will be maintained during construction. Signage will be placed well in advance to notify motorists of construction.
